



MITTENS

Mittens are worked from the fingers down to the wrist, so you can try on as you go. The thumb is added after the main body of the mitten is complete. There is no left or right mitten, as they will fit either hand.

SIZES

Approx S (M, L) 3" (3 1/4", 3 1/2") wide.
Length of fingers can be made to fit.

MATERIALS

Jo-Ann Sensations Soles & More yarn
(262 yards per skein): 2 skeins
(or any sock yarn)

C crochet hook (or size required for gauge)

Stitch markers

Tapestry needle

GAUGE

7 dc = 1" ; 7 rows = 1"



FINGERTIPS

Fingertip is worked in continuous rounds.

Chain 9; sc in 2nd chain from hook; sc in next 6 chains, 3 sc in next chain, place marker in 2nd sc of the 3 sc just made. Work in unused loops on opposite side of beginning chain; sc in each of the next 6 loops, 2 sc in the last loop, place marker. *2 sc in the next sc, sc in each sc across to 1 sc before marker; 2 sc in next sc; sc in marked sc; repeat from * moving markers up as you go until there are 40 (44, 48) sc total (20, 22, 24 between each stitch marker).

HAND

Hand is worked in continuous rounds.

Sc in each sc around until piece measures 4 1/2 (5, 5) inches from beginning or 1/2 inches before your thumb joins your hand.

Lay mitten flat; place marker at one side. Sc in each sc to 1 sc before marker; chain 15 (17, 17); skip next 3 sc & sc in 2nd sc after marker (thumb hole made).

Sc in each sc & chain around. Continue working in continuous rounds for 6 rows.

Fold mitten in half, fingertip flat; place markers at both sides. *Sc to 2 before marker; 2sc together (decrease made)* repeat for 5 rows.

Sc in each sc around for 8 rows.

In each of the next 2 rows work 4 evenly spaced decreases.



CUFF

Row 1: Chain 3 (counts as a double crochet); dc around

Row 2-4: Chain 3 (counts as a double crochet); *front post in next dc; dc in next dc* repeat around; join in beginning ch-3

Row 5: chain 1; turn; sc in each sc around; join in beginning chain. Fasten off.

THUMB

Thumb is worked in continuous rounds.

Join yarn with a slip stitch. *Sc around, working 2sc together in each corner where thumb meets palm for 2 rows.

Sc around until thumb measures 2" from where it meets the palm.

Sc, *sc 2 together, sc* repeat until only a small hole is left. Fasten off yarn & use tail to sew hole closed (on wrong side).

Weave in ends.

Optional: Turn inside out and brush the mittens to make them soft & fuzzy, then turn them right side out.



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
